Announces Grant of CHF 30'000.- for Young Independent Investigator

Plan and Research Focus The SGED/SSED will accept applications within any area of basic or clinical endocrinology and diabetes research. The application will qualify as either basic or clinical based on the project nature, and independent of the applicant's academic background (MD or PhD). The main purpose of this grant is to encourage young investigators to develop an independent line of research. All applications will be considered based on their intrinsic scientific merit.

Funding Research will be supported through the award of up to CHF 30'000.

Eligibility The upper age limit is 40 years. Candidates above this age may be considered, in the event of special medical and/or other factors that justify an exception. Candidates who believe that an exception may apply are encouraged to contact the SGED/SSED committee prior to a submission. The principal investigator must be a member of the SGED/SSED. The principal investigator (and co-investigators) must be employed in Switzerland at a non-profit institution, and the study must be performed at such a place of work. Advanced postdoctoral fellows planning to start their independent career in the near future and junior principal investigators who have recently started their independent career path are eligible.

The applications will be reviewed by the Research Commission of the SGED/SSED.

Reporting requirements

At the end of the funding period, but not later than two years after funding, all investigators funded by the SGED/SSED are required to present their work at the Annual Meeting and to submit a short scientific report. Investigators must acknowledge the support of the SGED/SSED in official publications (manuscripts, activity reports, etc.)
